



In the Maniototo, however, it was also the day Maniototo 4 Square and our awesome community featured on TV1's Breakfast Show to celebrate 95 years of 4 Squares in New Zealand.



This was well-deserved recognition of the extensive amount of work Martin, Michelle, daughter Morgan (pictured above) and team have put into developing our local 4 Square. To be chosen out of all the 4 Squares in New Zealand to host the birthday celebrations was a significant acknowledgement of not only how great the 4 Square is but also the café too. It has turned into a much needed, quality hub for our community. Martin and Michelle moved from Auckland eight years ago to take over the shop from Gavin and Eleanor A'Court. Improvements were quickly seen with repairs and painting and eventually the big days when the conveyor counter and automatic doors went in! Then the postal area and post office boxes were moved and a glorious new café put in. Maniototo Café is run by Morgan (who went on to win theCentral Otago Young Professional Award in 2017) and has provided the Maniototo community with a place which could look at home in any city in the country.

Martin and Michelle were approached by FoodStuffs last month asking them to be the feature Four Square and planning started immediately. "We wanted it to be

not only about the shop and café but the wider Maniototo Community," says Michelle. So, the sports clubs, the emergency services, the entire community were invited to come along and showcase what a busy, vibrant and diverse place we live in.

Emily came up with the idea four years ago and, upon a suggestion by a friend,

"I had the idea from an actual conversation that happened between my friend Liz and her daughter Eva in Whangarei. Eva was waking up and having a yawn and her Mum (Liz) asked what she wanted for breakfast. Eva replied she wanted weetbix but when Liz offered her lettuce for breakfast, Eva exclaimed, 'but lettuce is for dinner'." Emily ran the idea past them and so the journey began.

Emily read through the book to the Year 1 & 2 St Johns and Year 1, 2 & 3 Maniototo Area School students 'on the mat' and it was enjoyed by both the children and 'older' community members in attendance. Question time followed with Emily being asked what led her to write the book. "My Dad was a big reader and we were always at the library as children. I have a background in journalism and editing and have always loved reading."

Rina was asked if she enjoyed the process of illustrating the book. "Well, I'd never used computers to draw before so I drew everything by hand then traced it using the computer, so that was a unique experience."

Maniototo Community Library Team Leader, Aimee Pieterse said, "It's very exciting to have a new locally written book. We have a great selection of locally written history books but nothing like this – a children's book written and illustrated by two local people."

Emily and her partner Liga moved to the Maniototo five years ago from the Bay of Plenty after being based overseas in Latvia. They have since had their son Oto and purchased some land and a home in Patearoa.

Rina has lived in the Maniototo her whole life and is now studying first year engineering in Dunedin at the University of Otago.

### **COUNCIL CORNER**



Councillor Stu Duncan is a Wedderburn farmer and is in his second term as Maniototo representative on the Central Otago District Council. Stu has served six terms on the Maniototo Community Board and meets every six weeks in Alexandra for Council meetings and, just as frequently, for Maniototo Community Board meetings. When workshops

and additional commitments are included, there ends up something on every ten days or so.

Every couple of months Stu will be catching up with Positively Maniototo to keep you up to date on Council issues and communications. Each Councillor and Board member on the CODC have individual 'portfolios' or, in other words, are on sub-committees of council. Stu is the deputy Chair of the 'Roading' sub-committee which entails making sure the roads are safely functional and that the contract work is being done. "We deal a lot with Transit. One topic we've just been addressing lately is the open speed limit which has been discussed nationwide."

Stu was also in Wellington recently discussing the Wallaby issue with the Ministry of Primary Industries

(MPI). "It tied in with a trip up for family sport commitments, so worked in well. It's great to take the opportunity to meet at national level as it gives you access to the Ministers a bit more and gets the area on the radar."

When asked what it is about working for local and regional government that Stu is especially passionate about, Stu says, "It's the process involved in keeping the services in the area (such as the library and hospital) and making sure we do have the facilities needed by our community. Having the support of other rural communities helps too. I try to simplify things, take the complication out of it all. I look for simple solutions to the problems and enjoy negotiating through the issues."

Stu is more than happy to be approached by anyone in the community to discuss any queries or ideas you may have. You can do this by either calling in to the Ranfurly Services Centre and passing a message on or calling Stu direct on 021 224 2320. Do you agree with the below statement:

"It's better that she calves late than doesn't calve at all" Please read below to see why we don't agree with it.

Most New Zealand beef cow farmers run a spring-calving system dictated by the countries seasonal pastoral-grazing system. Under this system a calving interval (time between one calving and the next in an individual cow) of 365 days is most desirable. Most cows calve on an annual basis and generally close to the date they calved the year previous. Thus, a cow that is late this year will be late next year and every year after that, so, for all practical purposes, the cow will be late for her entire reproductive lifetime.

So how much are those late calving cows costing you? Let's put some monetary value on a condensed calving pattern compared with a longer period. Assuming calf birth weight of 35kg, weaning date 1 March (200 days from start of calving) and average LWG birth to weaning =1.0kg/calf/day.

**Herd A** - Spread out calving. Weaning weight calculated as: 1st period average age = 190 days (mid way 180–200 days) liveweight =  $(190 \times 1.0)$  + birthweight (=35 kg) = 225 kg. However, actual calf weaning weights for each 21 day spread were: 1-21 = 225 kg, 22-42 = 203 kg. 43-63 = 183 kg. 64-84 = 161 kg. 85-105 = 140 kg.

The average weaning weight for this cow herd with a spread out calving was 187 kg.

**Herd B** Condensed calving: 63 days calving period 15 August to 18 October – Bulls out 20 November and in 20 January (three cycles). The average calf weaning weight for Herd B would be 215 kg—using the same assumptions as for Herd A.

The advantage of Herd B over Herd A is 28 kg per calf. For a 100 cow herd with a 90% weaning rate the advantage is 2,520 kg of calf weaned which if being sold as weaners at \$3.20/kg equates to an extra \$8,064 income. In summary a condensed calving pattern allows a higher proportion of cows to be cycling when the bull goes out, easier management of cow feed requirements, heavier weaning weights, an even line of weaners for sale or replacement heifers and more money in your back pocket! ### **CLACHANBURN COMMENT**

Recent days have given us cold sharp frosts but lovely sunny days, typical Central Otago winter weather, which we like, including gardeners. The frosts kill bugs allowing us to grow healthy hostas with lovely leaves which have not been pitted with holes by slugs. Paeonies need and love a cold winter chill ensuring their buds will open to grow healthy stems and flowers in late Spring. Visitors from the northern regions can't grow these plants the same, just as we can't grow semi tropical plants – right plant, right place. It is one of the joys of visiting gardens in different areas and appreciating plants which are new to us.

### **Winter Bloomers**

Lovely classic cool season bloomers such as azaleas, camellias, rhododendrons and daphne, all acid loving plants are happy to grow together as they thrive in similar conditions – soil that is rich in humus, cool and moist soil but well drained and lime free.

In our garden, and many in the Maniototo, our soil is clay based and if built up with good compost, leaves and mulch in time will become ideal for these plants. They all like dappled sunlight especially in summer and not be allowed to dry out. It is a good time to give them a mulch of pine needles which are acidic and will be beneficial when they come into flower in late winter/spring.

Hellebores or winter roses prefer a slightly alkaline soil, but in truth they will grow alongside the above mentioned plants as well. The daphnes have the additional advantage of a beautiful perfume so grow them in front of the border so you can get a whiff of that too. Another plant which is happy growing in these conditions is the lily of the valley, which will also need to be in front as they are low growing.

Berries which are still giving a good red colour here at the moment, include Pyracantha *brilliant* and Cotoneaster *harrovianus*, and a Malus *snowbright* with lovely little crab apples. The birds obviously dislike them so that is a wonderful bonus. I have noticed recently quite a few Malus Jack Humm trees in Ranfurly, one near the Catholic church. It is a hardy strong growing tree with large red crab apples which also hang on well. I used to have one, and remember it became crowded and misshaped and was removed. Having admired them now in town, I think I might have to think where I could plant one in spring.

Are other gardeners thinking of new plants too, its fun isn't it. Hope you have found a good garden book to enjoy by the fire too.
